## **Contacting School if Your Child is Absent**

Please ring the school (01454 218 462) as soon as possible on the first day of absence – we have an automated answering system so a message can be left. Please leave your child's name, class and reason for their absence. If it is a prolonged absence, there is no need to ring the school every day but please do let us know if you do not expect your child to return by the end of the week. Please also remember that if your child has been ill with sickness and/or diarrhoea they should return to school 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.

**Medication in School** Staff are able to administer prescribed medication only. Parents can come into school to give medication eg. Calpol or Ibuprofen if required.

#### **Pupil Premium Eligibility**

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding (and able to get free school meals) if you receive any of the following:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods, and your monthly average income over three assessment periods should be no more than £616.67)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Children who get paid these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get free school meals.

- Ensure we have all relevant medical and dietary information;
- Make all payments via ARBOR parent portal. This includes wrap-around care, school meals\*, trips
  and other activities. If you require support with making payments, or anything else to with ARBOR,
  contact the office with your query.

\*When accounts get into arrears office staff are spending unnecessary time making calls and sending emails to request payment. **School meals should always be paid for in advance** and, where an account does get into arrears, we will be asking you to provide a packed lunch for your child until the situation is resolved. If you are facing challenges with paying for meals, please contact the office and we will work with you to resolve matters and provide support as required.
